
So, pay attention to the church calendar. Plan to attend and bring a friend or a neighbor. Bring some one who needs hope. Who doesn't?

The door is open. Come on in.



Baptist Men's Update

Proverbs 27:17 says as "Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another." Over the past month the men of Clayton First Baptist Church have been "sharpening" one another as we have engaged in events to grow us spiritually as well as doing local community mission work.

Our guest speaker at the March Baptist Men's meeting was Mike Sandlin, Director of Cape Fear Men's Ministry Coalition. Mike's message challenged us to support one another in our spiritual growth. He emphasized the need of men to continually disciple one another as we grow in our Christian faith.

Just like in Mark 2:1-12, we need to do whatever we can to support one another in our needs and get people to Jesus. In Ecclesiastes 4:9-10, it tells us "Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall one will lift his fellow. But woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up?". Mike's challenge to us is to have those guys who can lift us up when we fall, who can get us back focused on Jesus, and who are willing to do whatever it takes.

washed his house, cut trees down, cut limbs from his house, cleaned the rotten leaves and pine straw from his roof, tarped his roof to prevent leaks, and mowed his yard. This individual was truly appreciative of the work provided by the members of our church.

This is a one-day conference designed to equip men with resources and speakers who address the many challenges we face as men. Each session offered topics that help men to become better fathers, husbands, leaders, and men within our church and community.

Craving the Kingdom

Do you ever suffer from a food craving, a desperate hunger for one particular item that nothing else will satisfy? Have you ever been so thirsty you thought you would collapse if you didn't get some water? Do you have that kind of craving for the righteousness that characterizes the kingdom of God? Jesus addressed just that kind of craving in Matthew 5:6:

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied." (ESV)

In order to understand what he means we need to consider three questions.


What is "righteousness"? In this context, righteousness includes both justification and sanctification: being put in right relationship with God, leading to a progressive growth in personal holiness. It means freedom from sin and its power in all its forms. And it means freedom from self-righteousness and self-reliance. All of these are provided for us in Christ alone.

What does it mean to "hunger and thirst"? Most people in Jesus' day lived barely above subsistence level, with real hunger a constant threat and starvation always a shadow on the horizon. Water was scarce in Palestine, and in such an arid land, subject to hot and dusty winds, a parched throat and severe thirst were familiar experiences. This is the hunger of a person who is starving for food and who will die without drink. Psalm 42:1 captures the sense perfectly: "As a deer pants for flowing streams, so pants my soul for you, O God." (ESV) The Greek construction of this verse indicates that the hunger and thirst are all-consuming: hungry for the whole loaf, not just a bite; thirsty for the whole pitcher, not just a sip.

This verse describes a person who is desperate for the whole of righteousness, for complete righteousness. It describes someone who longs to be positively holy; someone who desperately wants to be like Christ. In this verse "hunger" and "thirst" are metaphors for a disciple's fervent desire for righteousness. They describe someone who longs to see God's final triumph over evil and his kingdom fully established, and who also longs personally to do what is right and just.

What does it mean to "be satisfied"? It means be filled completely, with nothing overlooked or left unaddressed. Satisfaction is a complete filling that fully satiates yet stirs up a greater hunger and thirst for righteousness, which leads to a fuller yet deeper filling than before—in a self-perpetuating cycle.

"They shall be satisfied" is in the passive voice, a "divine passive" that describes an act of God. He alone imparts the righteousness disciples hunger and thirst for. This perfect righteousness that Jesus speaks of here is in truth a divine gift given to his followers.



To "hunger and thirst for righteousness," then, is to long for the kingdom of God in its fullness.


