## Cultivate your spiritual life

Looking out my back window this morning I see I have a lot of work to do. Weeds that are growing in the flower beds mock me. My inattention to the raised bed is present for anyone to see. I've never had the "Yard of the Month" sign placed in my lawn, but I have prided myself on keeping the grass mowed and the shrubs trimmed. It doesn't take long for inattention to be evident. If I am not careful, my yard might begin to look like 1313 Mockingbird Lane. I have work to do.

Teresa of Avila once used an untended garden as a metaphor for one's spiritual life. She taught that when we do not attend to our heart, the place where the Holy Spirit dwells, weeds and undergrowth can quickly appear choking out the fruit of the Spirit that is forming in us. I like that image.

A few years ago, the field behind our house was farrow, meaning that nothing was done to it for over a year. Weeds grew tall. Small trees began to grow. The once tilled earth began to erode. It was obvious that if nothing was done to reclaim it as a place to grow corn and soybeans, it wouldn't take long before it would become a difficult place to farm.

Fortunately, a new owner arrived who took the time to recultivate the field. Equipment came to spray the weeds. The ground was tilled and raked. Fertilizer was spread. New rows were plowed. This summer we watched with amazement as cotton began to grow. In the late fall it looked as if snow had fallen. The field that for a time was untended became a place of beauty.

Tending to our heart is a constant work. Developing the habit of practicing disciplines requires a willfulness on our part to nurture our desire to grow in faith. Like pulling weeds, we must pay attention to our prayer life, reading the Bible, and coming together in worship. When we do not do our part to keep our hearts focused on Jesus, other voices plant seeds that choke out the seeds of faith much like in Matthew 13

where someone came while the farmer was sleeping and planted weeds in the wheat field.

I have a friend who is a farmer. Last summer he remarked to me that it bothers him that others don't understand how he can't take time away from the fields in the summer to go to the beach or the mountains. He said one week away, even three days gone, can negatively impact the crop, his income, the way he cares for his family. He told me, "You have to watch it every day!"

As winter gives way to spring, what do we need to do so that our hearts are ready to receive the seeds Jesus will plant in us this year? What do we need to do so that our hearts bear the fruit of the Spirit just in time for the harvest? As the Lenten season arrives, what can we do now in cultivating a receptive heart for faith to grow deeper within us.


## Heck-Jones Offering focus week ends Sunday
