The hopefulness of Lent is evident in the arriving signs of Spring. Although we entered this season together, we journey through the wilderness in solitude. No one can confess our sin for us. No one can accept a deeper relationship with Jesus as our proxy. Taking responsibility for our spiritual life is our task. It can be lonely. 
