Flocking Together

First Baptist Church Clayton Children's Ministry – FBC3M for short – is a ministry of coming to know Christ through loving, serving, learning and growing. We seek to connect to the example of Christ through scripture, considering how Christ loves, serves, learns, and grows, as well as when he does that and with whom. Christ paints a picture for our children of who God is and what God is like, and Christ teaches them about who the Holy Spirit is in his promise of the helper.

This Sunday, we look to what Christ is saying about himself, his followers, and his father as part of Good Shepherd Sunday. This is a title given to the 4th Sunday after Easter in the lectionary, when the texts point to John 10 where Jesus calls himself the Good Shepherd, and images of sheep, pastures, love, and leading fill the week's passages. It feels appropriate that on a Sunday when our children are leading, we stop to consider how we, like children, are dependent on Jesus, our very good shepherd.

In FBC3M our volunteers are like shepherds, guiding them in their spiritual formation journey. The children build relationships with their leaders, learning their voices and following them – even when how they follow might not be recognized immediately. I am grateful for each volunteer and the gifts she or he brings to the ministry. Whether it is leading boys on an extended retreat nature walk, creating stalactites and stalagmites for VBS, or engaging in creative Sunday School lessons, their gifts are beautiful, appreciated and remembered. Simply put, the ministry would not happen without the love, dedication and presence of volunteers gently guiding, teaching and prodding our youngest sheep.

I hear often as a Children's Pastor that children are important to our future; they are a gift and a blessing. While it is true we hope children will be the longest part of the future stretching ahead of us, children are an important part of the church TODAY. In fact, we see evidence of that on Children's Sunday, as our children lead in worship. Throughout the year, we see evidence of it as children serve alongside of us, teaching us through musicals, sharing with us their resources and time, keeping us on our toes with their

questions, and reminding us of our need for energy, play and laughter.

Our children bring value beyond Children's Sunday. They are a gift, yes, but one that needs to be opened. They are a blessing, yes, but one that needs to be empowered to share. They keep us learning, curious, inspired and encouraged. Praise God for our youngest churchgoers and those who guide them. May we welcome them as our Good Shepherd did, too.
