Woman's Missionary Union (WMU), an auxiliary of the Southern Baptist Convention, began in 1888 in the hearts of visionary leaders to pray and systematically raise money for missions.

Over the years through WMU's leadership, Baptist churches across the country have contributed over \$7.5 billion to support missionaries in North America and around the world through the Annie Armstrong Easter and Lottie Moon Christmas offerings. You probably have seen the Armstrong and Moon offering envelopes in the pew racks. Our church has been a long-time supporter of these wonderful ministries.

WMU's unwavering focus of making disciples of Jesus who live on mission bears fruit through discipleship, leadership development, and compassion ministries, with king-dom impact in every state and in nearly 50 countries.

WMU's goal is to work alongside churches to accomplish the mission of God and share the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. God issued the mandate for us to be involved in missions through the Great Commission. Our desire is to see all ages energized and motivated and equipped for missions.

GAs and Acteens to be honored on May 5
