How are you growing spiritually?

The Irises in our yard are especially beautiful this spring. Cathy planted the bulbs from her grandmother's Iris patch three years ago. Each year since, near the end of April, first of May, we see the evidence of growth that has occurred beneath the soil. This year there are twice as many blooming stalks of purple flowers. Seeing them, I am reminded of one of my favorite images in the book of Psalms.

Psalm 42:7 reads, "Deep calls to deep at the thunder of your torrents; all your waves and your billows have gone over me." This passage leads me to envision the Holy Spirit speaking deep within my heart, beneath the surface of my consciousness, encouraging growth, instilling wisdom, growing me stronger in the faith.

I imagine, like the Iris, that God is increasing my faith to produce more and more fruit for when God calls me into the right season. This growth, mostly unseen until called to show itself to God's glory, is often formed through life's struggles and challenges. This growth becomes evidence of God's work deep within when it breaks forth to add beauty where it was for a while absent.

Although I have never thought of myself as a preacher who preaches a series of sermons on a single topic, I am aware of threads that run through my writing during different seasons. At the beginning of our time together in January, I found myself coming back to the image of decluttering, making room for what God will provide us in 2024. This theme was because first, it was the beginning of a brand-new year, and second, it was the beginning of our time together.

I kept thinking that I needed to see you as a fresh, wonderful congregation where God wanted to show me just what I needed, and I hoped I could also help you to see the gifts God has for you in our time together. Often, we do have to declutter to make room for something new.

This spring, a different thread has emerged. I keep thinking that repentance is not only for admitting to God that we have sinned, that we were heading in the wrong direction, but I see it also as a time of admitting we were wrong about things and letting change

of heart occur in our relationships and attitudes. I am not the same person I was 34 years ago when I first began serving as a pastor. God has enlarged my vision, created new space in my heart to love people I may not have understood years ago.

I see some things differently. I am less judgmental, slower to condemn, hopefully more patient as I wait to discover the movement of the Holy Spirit working deep to deep in my heart.

Suffice it to say, listing my faults and mistakes would be futile – there is not enough room. Telling all the times I have had to admit I may have only considered my perspective without considering what others perceive would not be profitable. Cataloguing all the hurts and disappointments, the grief, and losses I have endured would take too long.

What is important is that like the Irises, God has been doing God's work deep to deep in growing me into who I am becoming. Without the twists and turns, the inner struggles, and deep faith wrestlings, I would not be who I am today. If there is any beauty to my testimony, any glory to be assigned, it is to God who has been directing the inner growth of the Spirit.

Having said this, how are you growing? How have you changed? Do you see the work God is doing in your life? I have to say, from where I sit, I see a lot of wonderful beauty emerging.
