As I walked across the yard, the grass crunched beneath my feet. It had been days since it rained, and I'd not yet turned on the sprinkler system. Temperatures have been in the 80s and 90s. It seems hot for late April early May. The sunlight has been harsh to the ground that is only now awakening to what the new season brings.

Having been dormant during the winter months, the grass is out of shape – like a runner who has not trained in months being suddenly thrown to the starting line of a marathon. The blades breaking under my feet do not yet seem prepared for the constant change of weather they'll face in the months ahead. They are dry and vulnerable.

The Psalmist's words in 143:6 come to mind, "I stretch out my hands to you; my soul thirsts for you like a parched land," and again in Psalm 42:2, "My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God?" The sound of the breaking grass awakens a thought in me: my soul too searches for God like a parched land, like a dry ground longing for water.

The week had been harder than some. More tasks than usual, extra worries arriving at the doorstep, not enough time to do all I need to do. Sleep has been difficult with things on my mind. I've had less control over my diet and exercise as I try to balance encroaching demands and meet the timelines of previous commitments. Gazing at my calendar, I become aware that my throat is parched. Water cannot quench this deep heart thirst. I need living water. I need worship. I need to spend time with Jesus.

In the heat of the day, she went to the well to draw water. She'd waited till the other women left. She couldn't take their judging looks, their condescending laughter, the gossip that was about her. If she had her way, she wouldn't have gone at all. Survival drew her there.

I imagine with each step she took she heard a crunching sound beneath her worn out sandaled feet. Parched, soul weary, out of shape, little did she know that God was aware of her deep heart groans. Little did she know that deep down inside there was a prayer taking place.
