# Share the life-giving joy of Jesus

At the Campbell University Divinity School graduation, Dr. Lydia Hoyle shared with the graduates three things to consider when preaching. Acknowledging the awesome responsibility of proclaiming the word, Dr. Hoyle suggested that sermons should be wise, kind and life-giving. I could not agree more!

The preacher must always consider that the congregation is made up of many people in a various of stages of faith development. Each person comes with their own specific needs. They are facing many different challenges. The words we share are meant not to insult but to encourage, not to harm but to awaken those with whom we worship to the wonderful opportunity faith can provide.

We must be wise to consider the challenges those to whom we share God's good word are facing. We must be true to the word of God sharing in love with compassion and respect for each person's journey. This is the role kindness plays.

People are often searching for a deeper relationship with God because something has happened in their life to awaken them to their need for deeper faith. Often this awakening arrives on the heels of disappointment or setback. Coming to know that we need help, realizing that we have "sinned and fallen short of God's glory," being faced with something that is upsetting, is often painful. Here, the preacher must not exploit, but be understanding, caring, offering hope and promise.

In short, through kindness, we proclaim the life-giving presence of Jesus to forgive, restore, and call those who feel broken and alone into the wholeness that life in Christ can provide. No sermon should fail to be life-giving. God sent Jesus into the world to provide us a way to receive abundant life. Personally, I hope that every time I preach, people leave feeling closer to God than when they arrived.

Thinking of this, I realize that these words are not just words for the preacher. They are words for all of us who share our faith with others. Years ago, I remember reading a Charles Swindoll devotion titled: <u>The Winsome Witness</u>. In the devotion, Dr. Swindoll talked about how our joy draws others to know Christ. He spoke about how people

would rather be around laughter than sadness, confident hope than dreary pessimism. As Christians we are all called to convey attitudes that demonstrate our hope in Jesus Christ, our assurance of the promises to come.

Today is Pentecost Sunday. As we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, I can't help but think of Paul's words in Galatians 5:22-23, "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." This gift in all of us is best shared in wisdom, kindness, and with an attitude to share the life-giving joy of knowing Jesus. All of us are called to share this good news!

Let us share with others as Jesus shared with the world. Let us have the same mindset of Christ (see Philippians 2:5-13). Let us work out our salvation with attitudes of awe and accountability, letting God work in us as God worked in the life and ministry of God's only begotten Son, Jesus our Lord.
