In Joy, Strength

"Do not be grieved, for the joy of the LORD is your strength" (Nehemiah 8:10b ESV)

Sometimes joy seems hard to come by. Joy is something we all desire – even crave – yet the cares, burdens and troubles of life oftentimes shut us off from it. Is consistent joy possible? If so, what's the secret?

In Nehemiah 8, Jews recently returned from exile have gathered in Jerusalem and spent the day listening to the reading of the Law – God's Word – and being instructed in its meaning. Conviction over their past failure to obey the Lord has stirred them to grief and sadness. But their leaders, including Nehemiah and Ezra, remind them that it is a festival, a day to celebrate God's goodness to them, so they should not be sad, but should rejoice. Why? Because "the joy of the LORD is your strength."

We can look at "the joy of the LORD" in a couple of ways. First, we can think of it as *our* joy *in* the Lord – the joy he gives us – that strengthens us as we live and walk with him daily. This is probably the most common way of understanding the phrase.

But there is a second way to look at "the joy of the LORD" that, to me, adds another dimension to this joy. The Hebrew word for "strength" in Nehemiah 8:10 literally means "fortress" or "stronghold." The joy of the LORD is our *stronghold*. Is it *our* joy in him that constructs that stronghold? In part, perhaps, but more so, I think, it is the *LORD's* joy *over* us – the joy he feels for his people – that is our stronghold and that sustains us. He is our never-failing fortress.

Proverbs 18:10 says, "The name of the LORD is a strong tower; the righteous run to it and are protected" (CSB). The LORD and his name are *one*. He fills us with joy but he also strengthens us and sustains us because he takes great joy in us!

So, let us be *joyful* and stand strong, because the LORD's joy is our strength, enabling us to weather the storms of life.
