VBS with the Spirit

I love Vacation Bible School. I love the energy, the loud music, the dance moves, the dressup theme nights, and most of all the children and adults who participate in this holy event each year. Honestly, I do not remember ever participating in VBS as a child although I know that I did. My first memory of this wonderful event is when a man named Frank Holder invited me, a youth, to help lead the music for VBS at Shiloh Baptist Church sometime in the early 2000s. It was during those summers of volunteering that I realized I not only had a gift but a passion for this work. I guess you can say, "the rest is history."

All these years later, I have grown to love VBS more and more because I believe it models a pivotal moment from Acts 2:1-6.

¹When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. 3 Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. ⁵ Now there were devout Jews from every people under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶ And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each.

Although we may not have the tongues of fire laying on each of us in a way that can be seen, we are definitely speaking in different languages during VBS. We are speaking in languages that our children and this modern culture can understand. Each night, our children will not
