# Children attend Friends Retreat at Camp Kanata

On Friday, September 20, we loaded up 13 of our third through fifth graders and traveled to Camp Kanata to gather with eight other churches and over 100 children for a weekend of learning, fellowship, play and FUN at the annual Friends Retreat.

The theme for the weekend was, "We are ONE," based on Ephesians 4:2-6. Utilizing an Olympic connection, we explored scriptures demonstrating the words of the Ephesians passage that call us to unity – humility, gentleness, patience, love and peace.

Saturday morning, we looked at the story of Joesph and his brothers, considering how the story challenges us to build unity in our families in the midst of jealously, hurt, repentance, and forgiveness. To expand beyond fostering unity in the family, we engaged in a mission project to benefit Miracle League of the Triangle, making cards of encouragement and collecting over \$1000 to pay for care packages and uniforms for children with special needs and their families, building unity, value, and belonging in the greater community.

We ended Sunday with worship and a look at the story of Lydia, who learned about Jesus and in turn shared her faith with those around her as we considered how sharing our faith and the love of Christ can create a ripple effect to build unity around the world. In all of the prayers, Bible Study games, and crafts, our children were reminded that together, we are ONE through the one God who calls, the one Jesus who shows the way, and the one Spirit who guides us toward one another in love. • UNC Johnston Health Mobile Medical Unit - In the spring, First Baptist will partner with UNC Johnston Health in a mobile prevention program with the goal of reducing chronic diseases and improving the health of our communities. The mobile medical unit offers free services and screenings to all. No insurance or ID required. Everyone is welcome.
