Time to develop spiritual discipline

When I was a child, my mom would sit on the side of the bed each evening and read us a passage from <u>Little Visits With God</u>, a book designed to teach children the value of daily devotions. A synopsis on Amazon reads: "Each devotion clearly articulates the message of salvation through Jesus Christ and offers practical examples of God's action in our lives today."

Over the years, I have long forgotten the lessons, but the memory of that special time remains with me. I still look forward to those moments each day set aside for God.


Lying in bed there was something comforting about knowing God was present in the life of my family. There was a warmth present as my mom read to us. It introduced to me and my siblings that God was present, active and always available to us. Thinking of God, as our eyes grew heavy and our breathing slowed, brought peace.

Remembering this, these many years later, I'm finding myself thankful once more for my mom's introduction to "Holy Habits." Perhaps those early memories are why my spirit is drawn to contemplative moments, why stillness and silence alert me to God's peace.

To this day, there remains in me a hunger and thirst for the knowledge of God's presence in my daily life. On my best days, I am aware I am "visited," and on my less than best days I am often mindful I have not paid attention as I should. The truth is God is always there, and . . . sometimes I get so caught up being an adult that I forget how to have the faith of a child.

Encouraging others to develop "Holy Habit" is a theme that God has woven into my pastoral work.

I know from personal experience, as well as watching others, how rich that work can be. The life we live is hard. We need what Heri Nouwen calls "a time and space set aside for God and God alone." We need the spiritual nourishment that surprises us with abundance often when we don't even know we are hungry.
