# See others as Jesus sees us

A passage of Scripture came to me this morning. I was thinking about our nation and praying for unity. I am deeply concerned about the divisions among us. My prayer is that we would see each other as Jesus sees us. I was praying that as Christians we might recognize the Image of God in one another, not focusing on what makes us different, but how in Christ we become one and in doing so be a part of God's healing touch.

I think back to 2 Chronicles 7:14, "If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, pray, seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land." There is much to unpack in this verse. It is a prayer of humility. It is not a prayer to gain power over others, but to seek God to have authority over all. It is a prayer of trust.

Only God can heal deep heart hurts that separate one from another. It is a prayer of confession and repentance. None of us are completely innocent. For God's best work to be done in us, we must be willing to let God do God's work in us. When we pray this prayer, we pray God will take the log out of our eye so we can help our neighbor with the speck in theirs (see Matthew 7).

The early church faced a myriad of distracting divisions that threatened to undermine their unity. Paul wrote these words to the Christians in Corinth urging them to set aside the categories into which they sorted one another. He wanted them to let go of the hierarchies and divisions that were so apparent in their culture.

Paul wanted them to see each other as spiritual beings saved by grace through faith. He wanted them to accept each other from heaven's perspective as if they were already there.

In 2 Corinthians 5:16-20 he wrote, "From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we no longer know him in that way. So, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; look, new things have come into being! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses


