The Lesson of the Advent Wreath

Advent is a season of preparing, waiting and watching for the fulfilment of God's promises to us. It is a time not only to reflect on the past, but to anticipate that Jesus is coming again and all creation will be made new.

The Advent Wreath is a powerful symbol of Jesus' approaching presence. Each candle has its own meaning, Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. The new day of his arrival grows closer each week until we finally light the Christ Candle in celebration of his birth; the revelation of Immanuel, God-with-us.

As we light a new candle each week, may it remind us of Christ's coming. And may it symbolize the importance of our own preparedness as we look for signs of Jesus' arrival among us.



Poinsettias

There are many colorful legends about how Poinsettias and Christmas became linked. According to one legend, long ago in Mexico on Christmas Eve, people flocked to church with bundles of flowers to fill the Christ child's manger. One of them – a little boy named José

- was very upset because he was too poor to buy any flowers.

The story has it that an angel appeared to him and told him to pick some weeds from a nearby field. José did as the angel



instructed, but when he placed the weeds in the manger, they were transformed into beautiful scarlet flowers, which Mexicans to this day, call the Flower of Christmas Eve

The Poinsettia has become a symbol of Christmas. The shape of the flower and leaves


are sometimes thought to symbolize the Star of Bethlehem, which led the Wise Men to Jesus, while the red colored leaves symbolize the blood of Christ and the white leaves represent his purity.

your continued support of this project.


