Dr. Keever called as Senior Pastor


First Baptist Church Clayton called Dr. Len Keever to be its Senior Pastor on Sunday, January 12. Dr. Keever, who served as interim pastor since December 2023, becomes the 23rd Senior Pastor of First Baptist in its 213-year history.


For over two years, the Pastor Search Committee worked tirelessly reviewing applica-

tions, conducting interviews, listening to sermons, and meeting nearly weekly to fill the position. It turned out God had His own plan for He had already found the right man.

Since he was hired as interim, Dr. Keever has served our church well. He quickly formed close relationships with members and has ministered to many families in the congregation. He and his wife, Cathy, certainly became a vital part of our congregation.

"I've grown into it," Dr. Keever said. "When I came here, I would have never thought that I would lead a church again. This past year





Dr. Keever received his bachelor's degree from Gardner-Webb College, a Master of Divinity from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Ky., and a Doctor of Ministry from Baptist Theological Seminary in Richmond, Va. He is a native of Black Mountain. He and Cathy, who currently live in Dunn, have three children, Seth, Lauren and Jared, and four grandchildren.

Dr. Keever's office hours are Tuesday – Thursday 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. He will work remotely on Mondays, and will also be available for meetings and appointments as scheduled. He issues an open invitation for phone calls and visits at any time.

First Baptist had been without a Senior Pastor since September 2021.

Recap of 2024; exciting start to 2025

2024 was a great year for First Baptist Church Clayton. We welcomed 31 new members to our fellowship and enjoyed the company of many others who regularly attended worship services, Sunday School, Wednesday night activities and mission-related events and meetings.

As faithful believers, what's most spiritually fulfilling are the 18 Baptisms conducted throughout the year. Rev. Stephanie Parker, who officiated at each one, said that as she looks back on last year, "I remember the excitement surrounding the celebration of that marker in their faith journey."

Twelve members were welcomed into God's Heavenly Gates, and 18 members requested to be removed from the roll or moved to another church.

We started charting Sunday Morning Worship attendance in 2024. Over the course of the year, the 9:30 a.m. worship service averaged 185. December 1 drew the largest crowd of 381. On March 31, attendance was 270. The next highest attendance was 250 on March 17. Estimated attendance for the Christmas Eve Candlelight Communion Service was 450.

Sunday School average attendance was 130. Top Sundays were January 28 and February 11 with 171 attending each time followed by 166 on March 17.

We're off to an exciting start in 2025. Attendance is up, the Holy Spirit is present and we're learning more about God's Word. We hope to see you every Sunday as we seek to Show God's Love, Tell the Good News, Grow Spiritually and Serve Others in our Community and World.

What? Jessica Collins wins Chili Cook-Off with delicious turkey soup with rice

Jessica Collins was the inaugural winner of the First Baptist Church Chili Cook-Off on Wednesday, January 8.

Only it was an instant pot recipe for turkey soup that won over the dinner guests/voters.

"I have to admit, I feel like I do not deserve this honor since I didn't even make chili," she exclaimed. "But I guess the people have spoken."

Elaine Johnson, one of the many members of the Basic Sunday School Class who organized the contest, presented Jessica with a prize gift bag for winning first place.

Here's the recipe for Jessica's Creamy Instant Pot Turkey Soup with Rice:

Ingredients

2 tablespoons olive oil

1 vellow onion diced

3 medium carrots sliced

1 yellow or orange bell pepper chopped

2 celery stalks diced

1 box + 1 can chicken or turkey broth

1 chicken bullion cube

1 box Rice-a-Roni Long Grain and Wild Rice

1/2 cup sour cream

2 cups turkey, diced or shredded (turkey can be cooked, uncooked or cooked & frozen)

Instructions

Set the Instant Pot to Saute and add the olive oil. Let it heat for a couple of minutes.

Add the onions and cook for 3 minutes.

Add the carrots, bell pepper and celery and saute for another 2 minutes.

Turn off the Instant Pot.

Stir in the chicken broth and deglaze the Instant Pot. Stir with a wooden spoon to loosen any vegetables stuck to the bottom. Then add the box of rice and seasonings.

If you are using uncooked turkey or frozen cooked turkey, stir it in now. If you are using leftover cooked turkey that isn't frozen, don't add it yet.

Put the lid on, lock it and put it on the Manual setting. Set the time for 5 minutes for white rice, 12 minutes for wild rice or 25 minutes for brown rice.

When the Instant Pot is finished let the pressure release naturally for 10 minutes. Then manually release the pressure. Add the sour cream and shredded cooked turkey to the pot, and stir.

Put the lid back on and let the soup sit for 5-10 minutes. Serve and Enjoy.
