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# What does membership mean? Part 3

When I use the word "Discipline," think more of those good habits we develop that help us to be healthy, to be better people. Brushing your teeth regularly is a discipline. Eating the right food takes discipline.

Regular exercise, the right amount of sleep, there are many disciplines we do every day. Likewise, to grow as a Christian, to deepen your relationship with God requires developing

good spiritual habits.

Some spiritual disciplines are obvious, like having a regular time each day for prayer and Bible Study. Others may not be as evident, like good stewardship and making good choices in where we place our priorities. One of the disciplines we often overlook is the importance of membership. When someone joins a church, they are committed to making worship a habit, service to others a habit, sharing their life of faith with others a habit. They are no longer guests but become one with other members, contributing to the identity of the people who support one

another in the journey to be better disciples of Jesus.

As spiritual discipline, members commit to being a part of the whole. Their commitment to one another is a promise of love and support. In marriage we pledge to love one another for better or worse, in sickness and health, in adversity and prosperity. When we become a member of the church we make a similar promise to one another.

The book of Acts speaks of the unity those in the early church shared. It did not mean that they gave up their identity. It meant that they took on a greater identity where unity was established by their love for Jesus and their desire to love one another as he loved them.

In the early church when one "joined," they became a part of the family. As a member of the family, they shared their lives with each other. They sought to know more about Christ.

They took care of one another, being patient and nurturing. They did not have membership as we define it today. They did not have databases and constitutions, denominations, or statements of faith. What they had was each other and a mutual commitment to love one
