Part 4: What does membership mean?

1 Corinthians 12 speaks of the variety of gifts we are given by the Holy Spirit. These gifts are for the building up of the Body of Christ. Our unique gifts reveal God's hand upon us. They not only help us to grow as believers, but they are also for the benefit of others.

Each of us is unique. Every one of us has been made special for purpose. I love how in Psalm 139:13-14 it says, "For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me

together in my mother's womb. I praise you for I am fearfully and wonderfully made."

In Jeremiah 1:5 it says, "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you, and before you were born, I consecrated you." What was true for them is also true for each of us. God has blessed us with unique gifts that give our lives purpose and meaning. Church membership provides us a place to discover those gifts and to practice them by sharing them with each other.

When a person joins the church, they present their gifts for the body as an offering to God. They serve on committees, take on responsibilities, share in leadership, join with other servants in enhancing one another's spiritual gifts. Much like giving a tithe of their income to support the mission and ministries of the church, they offer themselves and their unique talents and abilities to make the church stronger.

Often when someone is considering joining an association or club the question asked is "What is in it for me?" When someone joins a church, the same question may be considered but from a different perspective.

The benefits of church membership are not about discounts or privileges. Church membership is about being a part of something where our contributions are necessary for the growth and enhancement of the body. Therefore, a better question would be, "How can I be a part of what God is doing here?"

When we become a church member, we affirm the work of God that takes place in a particular congregation. We become a part of that work. As Baptists we believe that God provides everything a local congregation needs to be the church within the membership.

A Message from Budget and Finance

Question: Do Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) reduce Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA)?

Answer: Yes. A Qualified Charitable Distribution, i.e., a gift to First Baptist Church, satisfies the IRS's rules for Required Minimum Distributions.

If you want to give to the church and you are required to take a RMD, there is no reason not to utilize this tax-saving tactic.

Required Minimum Distributions are minimum amounts that IRA account holders must withdraw annually beginning the year they turn 73 (there are some exceptions – check with your tax advisor). RMDs are taxable income.

The PATH Act (Protecting Americans from Tax Hikes) provides an avenue for charitable giving directly from IRA retirement accounts, called Qualified Charitable Distributions. When this occurs, the taxable income on the RMD is eliminated.

It's a win-win for First Baptist and eligi-



ble church members. The church receives a gift, and the member avoids increased income taxes and taxes on Social Security, and increased Medicare premiums.
