
Part 5: What does membership mean?

I know a person who is a member of a certain organization. He pays his dues annually and carries his updated membership card in his wallet. The thing is, he has not been to a meeting in over 10 years, does not participate in their special events, he doesn't even read their newsletters and can't name one of the officers.

I asked my friend why he continues to pay his dues and he told me it's because it is just too hard to get back in if he ever wanted to. Here is the question: Is he

really a member?



A few weeks ago, I mentioned membership as a discipline. In a few weeks we will begin the Lenten season where we will spend time thinking about how to take on habits that nurture and strengthen our relation-

ship with Christ.

Certainly, Bible study and prayer are wonderful Spiritual Disciplines as are works of service and giving. When each of these are done as a regimented routine, they reinforce the bonds of relationship with Jesus, improving the foundation of our faith. Church membership and attendance are also ways we can strengthen our relationship.

As I gaze out the window I am beginning to see some green return to my lawn. The limbs of a maple tree are starting to turn red, indicating the rising of the sap that will soon help the buds to fill out into beautiful leaves that will draw in the sunlight feeding the tree and help oxygenate the air.

The view from my window provides two wonderful examples of why membership matters. First, I'm reminded that a well-manicured lawn takes constant attention. No one would mow their yard once a year and think that is enough.

FBCC to help with Hurricane Helene recovery

First Baptist Clayton will team up with N.C. Baptist Men Disaster Relief to help Hurricane Helene victims in the Swannanoa area. Men and women, age 18 and older, are encouraged to volunteer. The mission trip is March 30 through April 4.

The construction and repair work will consist of installing insulation, hanging sheetrock, and plumbing and electrical jobs.

You do not have to be skilled at any of this work to help. Just come and do whatever you can. The homeowners will most likely be on site and you will have the opportunity to witness to them.

The team from Clayton will sleep in the Swannanoa Baptist Church. Bring a cot or blowup mattress, and sheets, blankets or sleeping bag. There will be a shower trailer at the church. All volunteers will be provided three meals per day.

We will gather in the First Baptist parking lot at 8:30 a.m. on Sunday, March 30. Dr. Len Keever will commission the group and pray for safe travels. We will pull out at 9 a.m. After five days of work, discipleship and fellowship, the First Baptist team will depart for home at 9 a.m. on Friday, April 4.

If you commit to this effort please make sure it is a firm commitment. Sign-up sheets are located in the side vestibules. An information packet will be available Sunday, March 9. We may take one of the church buses. Prayerfully consider joining us on this relief effort to assist our neighbors in the mountains.
