#6 - Deliver us from evil

It is appropriate that we end our meditation on the Lord's Prayer on Easter Sunday. I can think of no better time to pray, "Lead us not

into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for Thine is the Kingdom, the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen!"



Certainly, on Easter morning the power and glory of God are most

evident. God's work in and through Jesus to establish a new covenant relationship with us by the forgiveness of our sins and the promise of eternal life becomes our ambition, our deepest heart desire. Nothing compares to what God has to offer us.

With this on our mind, with resurrection as our hope – the prayer to not be led into temptation, to be delivered from the Evil One who seeks to undermine God's work in us - takes on deeper meaning.

In the Beatitudes Jesus says, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness for they shall be filled." Easter's feast, Easter's celebration only increases our hunger and thirst for what only God can give us. When Jesus used the metaphor that the crowd had to eat his flesh and drink his blood, the Bible tells us that they left him saying, "This teaching is too hard."

Turning to the disciples he asked, "Don't you want to leave too?" Peter answered for them, "Where else can we go? Only you have the words of eternal life."

Only Jesus has the words of salvation. Only Jesus has experienced the resurrection. When we keep the empty tomb in mind, temptations pale in comparison. When we keep our thoughts on eternal life, choosing Christ becomes our highest priority. In the empty tomb we find irrefutable evidence of God's Kingdom rule, God's power and glory. With the stone rolled away, we see clearly how much God loves us.
