It was a beautiful Sunday morning. Like many Memorial Day weekends I remember, the weather had changed and the temperatures that day were lower than the

days before.



My grandmother used to say that every year when the snowball bush bloomed in her backyard it would turn colder. She called it "snowball winter."

If she had blackberry bushes perhaps, she would have taught me about "blackberry winter." That would be a lesson for another day.

God's creation is an amazing mystery, predictable and at the same time filled with wonders.

I love paying attention to nature, especially in the spring and early summer. The return of leaves on the trees, flowers blooming in the yard, watching the birds building nests, I am drawn to crave my own revival – a new season where my faith increases.

I know there is beauty in winter where roots grow deeper in the ground and na-

ture prepares for new arrivals. But my favorite time is now where nature's new season reminds me of Christ's resurrection, where hope is pronounced and signs of emerging fruit become more and more visible. I am reminded of the words in Revelation 21, "See, I am making all things new."

At church I noticed the petunias outside the office were dry. Their pink blooms were faded and the leaves parched. I went inside, found a jug, filled it with water, and gave them both an ample bath.

When the worship service was over and it was time to go home, I noticed the leaves were looking better. Today, when I returned to work, they looked much healthier. I thought to myself how good we all feel when we have received living water on a weekly/
