Depend on God, then your faith will grow

Have you ever noticed how much we grow in adversity? Some of my more intimate moments with God have been when I was going through something difficult.

Yes, my faith has grown during those times where blessings are evident, like mission trips and retreats. I also realize that I have had fruitful seasons when I have traversed through rough patches and times of uncertainty as God has led me through them.

In Romans 5:3-5, the Apostle Paul recognizes this. He writes, "we also boast in our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

This is very similar to the 23rd Psalm where the Psalmist writes, "Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me."



I have a friend who once shared about one of the most challenging times of her life. She said, "I never want to go through that again, and I hope, I never forget what I've learned about God's love for me I gained during that time." My friend told me that amid her suf-

fering she discovered she was not alone – that God was present, that faith made all the difference in helping her live through what she couldn't understand.

It was the growth in her faith that she wouldn't want to lose. As for the pain and loss, she would never want to go through it again.

The fact that our faith grows and God's presence gets us through the tough times is never meant to justify our loss or to cheapen our pain. Loss and pain are real. Grief is real. Loss is felt. The hole in our heart never truly heals. Trauma leaves behind something we never get over.

I for one don't want to go back and live though tough times. They have been painful; I wish they'd never occurred. I wish I
