Sunday School Class Spotlight

The Bible Academy Sunday School class was established in 2018, initially focusing on religious history. In 2022, John Paschal took over leadership with the ob-

jective of reading the entire Bible within a year, following a predetermined schedule provided by the Bible Project. The version utilized was Eugene Peterson's The Message, and the class read through the Bible in chronological order.

In 2023, the class chose to read through the Bible again, using each member's preferred version, covering from Genesis to Revelation. In 2024, the curriculum shifted to specific Books of the

Bible, utilizing plans from the Bible Project app. To date, the class has studied Romans and Revelation and is currently progressing through the New Testament at a slower pace, starting with Matthew.

The following individuals now lead the class on a rotating basis: Sarah Brooks, James Chanco, Bronna Greer, Donna Lee, Stacie Moor and Bill Moor. The Bible Academy welcomes participants of all ages, genders, marital statuses, and backgrounds. It aims to foster a deeper understanding of God and Jesus through reading His Holy Word. We are taking VBS 2025 on the road! Well, not literally, but the theme is focused on road trips.


We will look at "road trips" of people in the Bible who, through
