# Is your walk with God plumb?

I enjoy woodworking and doing construction on mission trips. I am fascinated watching carpenters join lumber, build cabinets and use their skills. I learn a lot watching them work.

It teaches me and gives me ideas of how to use my tools. I love how the act of watch-



ing them building something helps me understand things better.

In Amos 7:7-8 the prophet says, "This is what he showed me: the Lord was standing beside a wall built

with a plumb line, with a plumb line in his hand. And the Lord said to me, 'Amos, what do you see?' And I said, 'A plumb line.' Then the Lord said, 'See, I am setting a plumb line in the midst of my people Israel; I will spare them no longer.'"

I don't know if you have ever used a plumb line. It is basically a circular weight that is pointed at one end with a long string attached to the other. Gravity pulls the weight so that the string is perfectly vertical. Placing the line beside something tells you if it is crooked or straight.

It is one of the more ancient tools that is still a part of construction today. A plumb line assures that the wall is perpendicular. A straight wall is much sturdier than a crooked one.

In Amos, God is telling the prophet that God is going to measure the people according to God's truth, ethic and will for them. Next to God's plumb line, it will be obvious where they have failed, and where there is a need to repair the walls of their lives. Next to the righteousness and holiness of God, their need for repentance will be revealed, their need for change will be obvious. Next to God's plumb line they cannot hide.

When God sent Jesus into the world, God sent him to be our plumb line. In John 14:6 Jesus said, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." The life Jesus lived, the way he loved others, how he showed compassion and followed his Heavenly Father with uncompromised faith sets the standard for us.

Jesus' life measures us and shows us where we need to improve, what we need to do to make things right in our own lives and in our society. Standing next to Jesus, we are measured. Our flaws stand out.

I once watched a man build a stone wall


using a plumb line. It started straight and vertical but then he got off plumb a bit. The plumb line exposed his mistake. He had a choice, he could continue and build his wall crooked and in danger of falling, or he could take down the part that was off and work to make it right.

He chose the latter. He admitted his mistake and removed the rocks that were unacceptable in the place he'd placed them, measured them carefully, and reconstructed his wall to be true and beautiful to see.

Don't be afraid to stand next to Jesus, to watch how he lives and compare it to your life. God sent him to show us the way. And the way sometimes means to see that we need to do things differently, admit we took shortcuts and rushed ahead when we should have waited. It's better to confess our sins and let Jesus help us to do it right.

Normally children are taken to child welfare services to await placement in a foster home. This can take several hours, but sometimes it takes many days. These children are often scared, lonely and hungry and often have nothing but the clothes on their back.

The Isaiah House is a safe place with friendly and loving volunteers who provide clean clothes, toys, warm blankets, care and love. Their mission is to reduce trauma for children awaiting placement in a foster home, lighten the load for child welfare services and ease the transition for foster families.

The WMU will be collecting school supplies to be distributed to children/families in need at the August 5 meeting. Donated items may be placed in totes that will be at the dinner. Donation totes will also be located outside the church office.
