# Created in Christ for good works

Psalm 85:1-4a states, "Lord, you were favorable to your land; you restored the fortunes of Jacob. You forgave the iniquity of your people; you pardoned all their sin. You withdrew all your wrath; you turned from your hot anger. Restore us again, O God of our salvation."

Once again, the words of Henry Blackaby in the Experiencing God study comes to mind, "If you want to know where you are going, look to see where you have been." This is the message of the Psalmist. The writer wants the people of God to remember how God has sustained them in the difficult times and blessed them with new life.

God has forgiven them in the past, withheld judgement, and been merciful instead of punishing.

This is God's history with God's people. "Restore us again, O God of our salvation" both acknowledges what God has done for them in the past as well as recognizes the character of God who will sustain them into the future. Being reminded of God's character brings them peace during a very difficult time in their history.

Fast forward to the Apostle Paul's words in Philippians 1:6 when he writes to the

church, "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Jesus Christ." Here too God's people are reminded that

God will not leave them abandoned. Even in those moments when it seems like the Spirit is silent, or that God is elsewhere, God is present, actively working to complete in us what has already begun.



Our past helps define who we are, but our future with Christ defines who will we become. In Ephesians 2:10, Paul wrote "we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we may walk in them." Growing as a Christian is not about continually starting over.

Our life in Christ is not like the movie Groundhog Day where the character wakes up repeatedly each morning to relive the same day. Each day is a day to grow in Christ, to learn from our successes and our mistakes, to gain wisdom and understanding as we look back to where God has been with us. Every morning is a time to reflect
