This morning, I thought of an image that has helped me over the years. A cook was saying that if she had a cup of sweet milk



and a teaspoon of vinegar, she'd have just that, a cup of milk and a teaspoon of vinegar.

But if she mixed them, she'd have a cup of sour milk. Her point was that God cleanses our hearts

and makes us sweet and pure, it is when we allow negative things into our mind that things go sour.

I was reminded of this sitting on our deck this morning doing my routine of devotions. I was watching the leaves fall to the ground, noticing that the sun now comes up on the other side of the house and the irises and azaleas are getting more morning light. I was enjoying the peace of the moment when I started thinking about the tasks before me, wondering how I was going to fit everything into the week ahead..

With my guard down, my mind shifted to current events and chores. Before I knew it.

the senses of peace and calmness were replaced with the bitterness of stress and the acerbic taste of worry.

What happened? I'd allowed a teaspoon of distraction sour my thoughts. I'd let the things on my calendar, deadlines and headlines, invade my thinking and pollute the pureness of the moment – and I could not get it back easily.

See, while a teaspoon of vinegar can spoil a cup of milk, a teaspoon of milk can hardly change a cup of vinegar.

Every morning, we are awakened to the dawn of an unspoiled day. Every morning the Holy Spirit calls us to attention, desiring to feed us with the purity of God's presence. Each day brings the potential of a fresh start. The question we must ask ourselves is how quickly are we allowing sourness to rob us of this gift?

I knew of a father who offered his daughter \$10 if she could go a day without chewing on her fingernails. What do you think God might do in you if you could go a day without giving your attention to negative things? How much more meaningful do you think your morning would go if you didn't turn

tains who were victims of the floodwaters brought on by Hurricane Helene last fall.

A commissioning will be held during the 9:30 a.m. worship service. The team will depart shortly thereafter.

For four days, Monday - Thursday, First Baptist volunteers will install insulation,



hang sheetrock, and perform plumbing and electrical repairs and installation.

The First Baptist team will also be witnessing to local homeowners and other disaster relief personnel.
