# Budget is more than just numbers; it's about the ministries and people

Long ago, in a church far, far away, I remember a particular conversation I had with one of the employees of the local Baptist Association. I had dropped by to bring some supplies for the clothing ministry our church had collected when she told me that she was having a hard time raising funds for a project that was near and dear to her heart.

"Every meeting I stand up and beg for funds," she said. "At the annual meeting they voted overwhelmingly to set up the designated account, but hardly anyone is giving to it."

As I listened to her, I thought back to our recent meeting recalling her plea for help. She had indeed stood before the body and made a passionate plea for X amount of dollars. However, sitting in her office she wasn't talking about money, she was talking about needs and how the ministry would help so many families in our area.

I asked if I could offer a suggestion? She agreed. I then said, "I think the next time you shouldn't ask for money, you should share the passion I hear in your voice. Don't talk about the budget, talk about the women

and children we are helping, talk about how appreciative they are."

Today, we are getting a look at the proposed budget for 2026 for the first time.

Please don't look first at the numbers on the righthand side of the paper, look at the ministries and opportunities listed on the left-hand side. A church budget is not just about numbers; it is



about the work of the church.

It is about keeping the lights on, the room warm in the winter and cool in the summer. It is about the one hundred plus children who come to Vacation Bible School to learn about Jesus. It is about reaching out and partnering with ministries outside of the church.

It is about 60-plus youth having a safe place to make and nurture relationships, 60-plus children who begin their spiritual formation here, the parents who find support and encouragement raising children in today's world.

It is about our senior adults who look to the
