Little surprises can help us grow closer in our relationship with God

I love surprises, especially the ones that alert me to God's presence. Last night, standing in the live nativity as Joseph (at my age I think it would be more appropriate to be Zacheriah or Simeon), I had one of those moments.

Looking down on baby Jesus lying in the manger, I was reminded that I'd been there before, a little more than 60 years ago. I suddenly remembered standing on the stage in the fellowship hall at First Baptist Church in Black Mountain dressed in my flannel bathrobe, playing the part of Joseph at the Sunday School Christmas party.

I'd progressed from the role of shepherd, through the ranks of being a wise man (I never got to be an angel, thus letting me know my teachers knew who wasn't always paying attention in class), to finally arrive in the exalted position of Joseph. This was the last year I'd be in that department, my final chance to reach the high status of standing next to Mary, gazing down at a manger made from an old orange crate, filled with straw that had seen better days, snuggling an old baby doll wrapped in someone's dis-

carded sewing scraps.

This memory came to me last Thursday night as I stood looking down at the doll that signified Jesus' sleeping peacefully after the

hard journey from divine to human, zygote to breathing on his own, to be born of Mary. I stood there thinking of how much Jesus has come to mean to me.



I thought of my own

journey from primary department to pastor, from innocent child to born-again believer struggling to grasp that deeper meaning of what it means to breathe in the breath of the Holy Spirit; to know more fully the life God is calling me to grow into. It was a wonderful moment, standing in stillness, aware of the blessings that surround me, thinking of how far God has brought me on this journey.

Of course I was not alone at the nativity. Cathy was there as Mary, God's gift to share this adventure with me. There were wise folks present whose faithfulness we can all depend on. Around the corner were shepherds, those who journey with us, encour
